Below are COVID-19 Vaccination Updates by County:

Bucks:

Homebound patients: Taking names for homebound list. Email vacfacts@buckscounty.org with "Homebound" in the Subject line. Include the following: Name, DOB, telephone number, home address and email (if applicable).

Bucks County Health Department: Bucks County Health Department is currently registering essential workers of Bucks County who meet the following criteria for COVID-19 vaccination scheduling (Phase 1A) and pre-registering for Phases 1B and 1C.

Doylestown Hospital is currently vaccinating patients of practices associated with Doylestown Health. The practices on the hospital's medical staff are given a specific number of patients they can schedule per week based on the number of providers and size and relevance of their practice. The vaccinations are taking place at Doylestown Hospital and Doylestown Health Urgent Care. The practices are reaching out to their patients to schedule them through our enterprise-wide electronic medical record. We are following the state's guidelines regarding eligibility.

Chester:

Homebound patients: Register by calling 610-344-6225, currently they are working on a plan to distribute vaccine.

Chester County Health Department: Please complete the pre-registration form if you **live or work** in Chester County or Delaware County and are interested in receiving the vaccine.

NOTE: If you are age 16-64 with a medical condition (see Phase 1A below) that now identifies you as Phase 1A, and you completed the previous survey, please complete the pre-registration again. If you already completed the previous survey and are not age 16-64 with a medical condition, you do NOT need to complete the pre-registration again. Chester County is currently administering the Moderna vaccine which is approved for use in individuals aged 18 and older. Chester County and Delaware County CANNOT administer the vaccine to anyone ages 16-17.

Delaware:

Homebound patients: While Delaware County continues to serve the community at the public vaccine locations, plans are moving forward to begin the work of getting vaccines to county residents who are unable to leave their homes. If you are a Delaware County resident who is homebound or know of a county resident who will need to receive their vaccine in their home, please contact the Delaware County COVID-19 Call Center at 484- 276-2100, or by email at Covid19resources@co.delaware.pa.us to be added to the list of residents who will be served by this program. Information needed includes the name of the person to be served, a phone number, zip code, and an email if applicable. Work to identify these individuals have already begun with our community partners and county agencies, and more information will be available soon.

Please do not complete multiple forms and do not email to check the status of your request. Completing this form DOES NOT guarantee that you will receive the vaccine from Crozer Health.

Montgomery:

Montgomery County Health Department is preparing for vaccine roll out with online pre-registration the expanded 1A phase. Individuals in these groups can pre-register here:

Montgomery County reports approximately 170k individuals have pre-registered for the Covid vaccine and a notice on their website reports "it may take between 6 to 10 weeks before you hear back from us about scheduling an appointment. We are booking appointments to match our supply Around 80k residents have received at least the first dose."

Philadelphia:

Homebound patients: Contact the Black Doctors Consortium at homevax@blackdoctorsconsortium.com to request a vaccine. You must be a Philadelphia and meet the criteria for Phase 1B.

FEMA has opened a the “Center City Vaccination Center” for Philadelphia residents at the PA convention Center and will be expected to be open for the next 6 weeks. The site is expected to administer approximately 6k doses daily, seven days a week for 12 hours a day (8am to 8pm). Residents can get on the list by signing up at phila.gov/vaccineinterest or calling 311.
