#### 2023-'24 State Budget Status

- NYS budget is late and negotiations are ongoing
  - ◆ Two budget "extenders" have been passed to temporarily fund NYS government until a final budget agreement is worked out.
    - Bail reform
    - Housing
    - MTA funding
  - Do not anticipate anything in the final budget agreement that would adversely impact the proposed budget.
    - Agreement in Albany with the full phase-in of Foundation Aid and funding of expense driven aid categories.
    - Unknowns:
      - Universal meals
      - High-impact tutoring set aside

### **Budget Highlight Summary**

- Maintains existing programs and services
  - ♦ UPK, Finance Academy, Ag Program, Project Lead the Way, Career Tech, foreign language, music, athletics, Center for Positive Solutions, and other elective courses
  - Preserves building discretionary budgets
  - Extraclassroom and afterschool activities
- Adds:
  - ♦ 1.0 FTE School Resource Officer
  - 1.0 FTE Orchestra Teacher
  - ◆ Exchanges a 0.8 FTE BOCES Counselor for a 1.0 FTE Pioneer Counselor
  - Exchanges a 1.0 FTE BOCES Teacher for a 1.0 FTE Pioneer Teacher
  - ♦ Includes 2.0 FTE's for Elementary CPSE/CSE Chair and MS CSE Chair
  - Includes 1.0 FTE Special Education Administrator
  - Includes 1.0 FTE Academic Services Administrator
  - Approx. \$17,000 for buildings supplies across all four buildings
  - Increase technology equipment replacement budget by \$15,000
- Carries a tax levy increase below the tax cap
- Plan reduces reliance of Assigned Fund Balance
- Strategically positions us well for 2024-25
