## **INTERPRETIVE GUIDANCE**

Number: COVID19-02

**Date:** March 19, 2020

**Re:** Order of the Governor of the State of Maryland, Number 20-03-19-01, dated March 19, 2020, Amending and Restating the Order of March 16, 2020 Prohibiting Large Gatherings and Events and Closing Senior Centers, and Additionally Closing Various Other Establishments

## 1. Update to OLC Interpretive Guidance COVID19-01.

- a. Interpretive guidance #COVID19-01 issued by the Office of Legal Counsel ("OLC") is <u>no</u> <u>longer valid</u> with respect to the following, which are addressed by the above-referenced Order:
  - i. Enclosed Malls (as defined in the Order); and
  - ii. food courts.
- b. OLC's interpretive guidance #COVID19-01 remains valid with respect to the following:
  - i. shopping malls that do <u>not</u> meet the Order's definition of Enclosed Malls;
  - ii. food trucks;
  - iii. private clubs;
  - iv. funerals; and
  - v. barber shops, hair salons, and certain spas.
- 2. <u>New Interpretive Guidance</u>. At this time, OLC recommends that the Administration interpret the above-referenced Order as follows:
  - a. <u>*Physical Therapists.*</u> The provisions of the Order requiring closure of fitness centers and other similar facilities do <u>not</u> apply to licensed physical therapists <u>when they are engaged in the practice of physical therapy or limited physical therapy</u>, in accordance with Title 13, Subtitle 1 of the Health Occupations Article of the Maryland Code.
  - b. <u>Convenience Stores</u>. The Order does <u>not</u> require closure of convenience stores. See also 2.c below.
  - c. <u>Dining Areas in Grocery and Convenience Stores</u>. Owners/operators of grocery and convenience stores that include areas for on-site food consumption should remove tables and chairs from, or otherwise restrict access to, those areas.
