MEDICAID AND CHIP CONNECT KIDS TO HEALTH CARE IN EVERY PENNSYLVANIA COMMUNITY



Across Pennsylvania, from our rural communities to our urban centers, kids rely on Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) for their comprehensive health insurance, including more than 1.1 million children enrolled in Medicaid and more than 179,000 children enrolled in CHIP.

Nearly half (46%) of all Pennsylvania children receive health insurance through Medicaid or CHIP

Especially during tough economic times, Medicaid and CHIP play a pivotal role in providing children a lifeline to access health care, which gives parents the peace of mind knowing their children have quality coverage. This safety net has been as important as ever during the COVID-19 health pandemic and resulting economic crisis.

In fact, we've seen unprecedented increases in enrollment as more children and their families have turned to Medicaid and CHIP. During the first six months of the COVID-19 pandemic, enrollment in Medicaid and CHIP increased by 5% or by more than 69,000 children.

We urge elected lawmakers to keep Medicaid and CHIP strong by supporting adequate federal and state funding necessary to meet the increased level of need in Pennsylvania.

As the severity of COVID-19's impact continued on for months, and now into 2021, the importance of sufficient, stable funding for the Medicaid and CHIP programs at both the state and federal levels is more critical now than ever for children and families, especially in light of Pennsylvania's estimated \$3.5 billion budget deficit for FY 2021-22.
