WHEREAS, after graduating from high school, Reverend Art Cribbs became involved with a civil rights project sponsored by the American Friends Service Committee; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Art Cribbs dreamed of becoming a career officer in the military; however, after spending the summer working with Quakers, he was converted to pacifism; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Art Cribbs earned his Bachelors of Arts degree in Political Science from the University of California at Berkeley and a Masters of Divinity from the Chicago Theological Seminary; and

WHEREAS, in 1999 Reverend Art Cribbs moved from Cleveland to San Diego with his wife, Kana, and their four children; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Art Cribbs is the former executive director of the Office of Communication for the United Church of Christ; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Art Cribbs is the pastor of Christian Fellowship Congregational Church, United Church of Christ, in San Diego; President of Pacific Media Ministry; and cofounder of the Concerned African-American Clergy and Laity, which addresses issues of HIV/AIDS in San Diego County's African-American communities; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Art Cribbs is an ethics instructor with the Justice Training

Institute, a contractor with the California Department of Justice, and works closely with police
executives throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Art Cribbs has been a news reporter, talk show host, news director, public affairs director, bureau chief and national correspondent for Essence Communications, local ABC and CBS television news departments, Independent News Network, Cox, Viacom, and Gannett; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Art Cribbs is a past president of the Ecumenical Council of San Diego County; former chair of the communications committee for the California Council of Churches; member of the United Methodist Reporter and Lumicon boards of directors; trustee of the United Church of Christ Pension Boards; member of the board of directors of the United Church of Christ Office of Communication, Inc.; media consultant for the Episcopal Church's Jubilee Ministries programs; former board member of *Sojourners Magazine*; serves on the San Diego Citizens Equal Opportunity Commission; and is co-convener of the Coalition For Justice in San Diego County; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, does hereby commend Reverend Art Cribbs for his passionate commitment to the spiritual growth and general well-being of all the citizens of the City and thank him for the many hours he has volunteered toward community building.
