Whereas, the Gopher Tortoise has been living on the earth for 500,000 to 2 million years; and

- Whereas, the Gopher Tortoise is currently listed as a threatened species in the State of Florida, and in parts of the United States they are federally listed as threatened; and
- Whereas, the Gopher Tortoise is considered a keystone species, due to the protection their burrows provide to more than 350 other species, some of which are also listed as threatened; and
- Whereas, a thriving population of Gopher Tortoises in our region helps to sustain the area's ecology and provide our citizens with a source of joy and appreciation for nature; and
- Whereas, recent efforts by the State of Florida are underway to help ensure that gopher tortoises are restored with secure, viable populations throughout their range in Florida.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida hereby proclaims April 10, 2024 as
