


Stephanie King (she/her)

This graduate program is important to Stephanie because of the emphasis on community and social justice, she shared that a highlight of the program itself was "Building connections with everyone in the cohort, shout out to the Wolf Pack!". Since the Doctoral program is unique in the region and one of the only programs of its kind in the country, Stephanie chose UW-Green Bay after attending a listening session hosted by the program faculty and staff. With in-person classes being the foundation of the program, Stephanie found that as a working mother and commuter student the greatest resources were the library and online databases available for free to UW- Green Bay graduate students. Stephanie has two years to go before graduation and is looking forward to a future working closely with First Nations communities.

NEW PROGRAMS



M.S. in Nutrition & Integrated Health

With a start date of Fall 2021, this program combines an innovative curriculum and practicum experiences for those seeking advanced nutrition knowledge and careers as Registered Dietitians. Bellin Health, Aurora, and St Vincent's Hospital, are just a few of the local clinical partnerships where students use their nutrition knowledge to improve health in patients. With credit for prior learning, the availability of in-person and online courses, and full or part-time tracks, our master's curriculum gives flexibility to all learners interested in working in the nutrition field.

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M.S. Cybersecurity

Our fresh and innovative Cybersecurity program is formatted to prepare our learners for the unpredictable. Cybercrime threats never take a day off, and our cybersecurity students will learn what it truly means to think on their feet and anticipate ways to better safeguard companies. This 34-credit program is offered online and has multiple tracks available for students to specialize their education. Students will have the ability to design the best project-based, self-starter master's degree experience.

The Office of Graduate Studies provides travel and research grants to degree-seeking graduate students so they may continue to expand their knowledge and research. This past academic year we awarded almost \$5,000 in combined travel and research grants across our graduate programs including Athletic Training, Environmental Science & Policy, First Nations Education, Nursing, and Social Work. Students were able to attend conferences and present their research, while others were able to purchase supplies to continue their research in the field. Grants are awarded every academic year and we are excited to see what our students will accomplish this coming year!
