

Association of Population Centers ArXiv (APCA) Moderation

Purpose

APCA accepts research papers in the population sciences, broadly defined. We accept work from scholars who are faculty or postdoctoral affiliates of the Association of Population Centers (APC) population centers. Papers can also be authored by ABD student affiliates of APC population centers; faculty affiliates must submit the papers on student affiliates' behalf. Authorship and affiliations must be clearly stated on the title page.

APCA papers are hosted by SocArXiv, and are subject to their moderation policy (here).

After papers are posted to SocArXiv, authors with accounts on the Open Science Framework platform (which hosts the service) will be able to post associated research materials on the site.

APCA accepts papers at any stage of the publication process (preprints, working papers, post-prints), in any version the authors have the legal right to share.

We ask authors to provide a subject area (e.g., population, sociology, geography).

We do not assess the quality of the work or verify copyright status. Acceptance is not a statement about research quality.

Papers must be individual works (not edited collections).

Subject to volume demands, we expect to post papers submitted for moderation within 3 business days.

We only accept papers in English at this time.

Papers should be in MS Word or PDF formats.

If a paper is not accepted, we will notify authors of the reason. Authors are free to resubmit such work after addressing the issues raised by the moderator. Authors also may contact Betsy Alafoginis betsy@popassoc.org to discuss or appeal a moderation decision.

Authors who have committed other ethical violations may be blocked from further posting.

APCA will attach a cover page, with a paper series number, to each paper we accept, and host a numbered list of papers on our site.

Authors wishing to provide updated versions should go through the submission process again, and notify us it is a new version.

If a paper is accepted for publication in a journal, please notify us (Betsy Alafoginis betsy@popassoc.org) of the DOI for the article, and we will add it to the SocArXiv record, allowing readers to click directly from the APCA version to the journal version.

Preprints are indexed by Google Scholar. If a paper is accepted for publication, authors can go into their Scholar profile and merge the preprint with the published version.

Note that SocArXiv will not withdraw papers at the request of authors or journals – once posted they become part of the permanent scholarly record. Readers arriving at the URL for each paper will always see the most recent version first. (The SocArXiv withdrawal policy is here.)
