

COVID-19 Vaccine Resources for Homebound Patients by County

Bucks

The county's homebound vaccination program wrapped up in July, but if residents still need the service, they can call the health department at 215-345-3318. Residents may contact county-run vaccination sites and ask to have the shot administered in their car.

For those unable to drive, contact the [Bucks County Transport](#) for possible options. [Other resources](#) are also available for those looking to get the vaccine.

Delaware

Individuals can contact the Delaware County COVID-19 Call Center to add themselves or a homebound loved one, friend or neighbor to the "Homebound Roster" for an on-site at-home vaccination. Information needed includes the name of the person to be vaccinated, a phone number, zip code, and an email if applicable.

Chester

If you are a community, group, or organization that would benefit from the Chester County Health Department bringing COVID vaccinations directly to you, please complete the [Community Vaccination Request](#). Please complete the request only once and vaccine team will follow-up. The completion of a request does not guarantee vaccine.

Montgomery

Please call the Hotline at 1-833-875-3967 and tell the operator that you/loved one is homebound. You will be transferred to a representative who will ask you for your information to assess persons for whether they are homebound and to register them in the scheduling system.

Philadelphia

PDPH: This program is available for any individual who is homebound or for anyone who would have difficulty being vaccinated at a clinic due to a disability. As part of this program, personal care attendants, family, and any other caregivers or residents of the household are eligible to be vaccinated during the same visit.

If you are interested in setting up a vaccine appointment for yourself or a person who is homebound, call 311 or 215-685-5488 (dial 711 for TRS/TTY assistance) or fill out [this form](#). Once you are registered, you will be contacted by that provider to schedule an in-home vaccination visit. It may take 1 – 2 weeks to get your appointment scheduled.

COVID-19 vaccine is free, though some providers may bill insurance if you have it.

Healthcare organizations or professionals interested in helping to vaccinate people who are homebound can email vaccines@phila.gov to learn how to enroll as a COVID-19 vaccine provider and how to participate in the Health Department's homebound vaccination referral program.
