President's Message



Our Foundation board members strongly believe that school field trips are an important educational tool to expand students' horizons and give them in-person experiences they might not have otherwise. That's why our School Field Trip Program is our best- funded charitable outreach to the community.

However, last year almost none of the schools that received our field trip grants had the opportunity to use all, or even some, of the money before the COVID-19 restrictions were put

in place. That money was still unused when our Foundation board set up the budget this year.

So after thoughtful discussion at several meetings, the board advised the schools that this year the grant money also may be used for any educational enrichment program or activity that meets the guidelines of Oregon State standards.

Results have been heartwarming. We've received letters and cards from principals and teachers telling us how thrilled they are to have funding for special materials and activities that are appropriate during this time of continuing limitations on in-person learning. (Field trip transportation today requires three times as many buses as in the past due to social distancing requirements, making it prohibitively expensive.)

We optimistically look forward to next year, when we hope school instruction will be more like the "old" normal. In the meantime, we feel confident that our philanthropy continues to make a positive difference in the lives of children from low-income families in the greater Portland area. Community Transitional School Update

Your Foundation has supported the Community Transitional School for the last eight years with a financial grant to help fund a full-time teacher's aide. This year our amount was \$7,000. In



addition, at Christmas time, generous Rosarians contributed about \$2,000 in individual checks to the school.

CTS is a private, pre-kindergarten through eighth-grade school that serves about one hundred homeless and transitional children who live in the city of

Portland and East Multnomah County. The highly qualified and experienced staff is made up of four state-certified teachers, two full-time instructional assistants, one full-time teacher's aide, and a Title 1 instructor.

The school's mission is: "To provide at-risk children with a stable educational environment that promotes their academic and personal growth."

When the COVID restrictions were put in place more than a year ago, the school staff faced a difficult challenge. While other educational institutions were able to continue instruction electronically, the CTS staff knew their students had neither the computers nor reliable internet connections to make Zoom classes possible. So the three little buses went out each day, month after month, to deliver assignments and worksheets to the children, wherever they were living – in cars, tents, shelters, and occasionally a cheap motel.

CTS resumed daily, in-person learning in early March of this year. Pupils were excited and happy to have the stability again in their lives that the school provides.

Because of their chaotic lives, almost all of the children are behind their grade-level peers in academic achievement, so CTS typically provides a five-week, half-day summer program that focuses on reading and writing. This year, however, the school is planning to extend the regular school year into July with full-day classes.

The Rosarian Foundation is pleased to be a small part of the important work this school is doing.

Ethos Music Center Update

We at Ethos could not do what we do without the community support of organizations like the Royal Rosarians. This year's donation from the Royal Rosarian Foundation has

helped provide hundreds of lessons for students who would otherwise not have access. We appreciate the good work you are doing in our community and are proud to receive your support. Thank you Royal Rosarians!

Ethos Music Center provides music education for youth in Portland and

across rural Oregon. Ethos reaches thousands of students each year through four distinct programs: Music Lessons for Kids provides individual and group lessons at our headquarters for a sliding scale fee, our Rural Outreach Program (through a partnership with AmeriCorps) provides in-class instruction for students in rural area schools, Music Corps provides free after school group lessons at SUN schools, and Pass the Mic provides free after school group lessons and instruments for students with priority given to immigrant background youth.

This year more than ever, music has been an incredibly important part of our students' lives. In a year of so much uncertainty, rapid change and surges of racism that many of our students have faced; music has been a steadfast tool for self-expression, joy, connection, and self-confidence. The discipline of practice not only creates positive habits for students, it also creates a sense of consistency and routine in a year that has been anything but. It is well documented that students who receive music education score higher on tests, report more engagement with school, and typically see an improvement in learning overall. Music and arts education is a benefit to students and a benefit to the community.
