#### **ACPE Site Visit Wrap Up**

The Manchester University Pharmacy Program hosted the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) from April 12th – April 14th. Over those three days the visit team met with leadership, faculty, staff, students and preceptors to discuss the pharmacy program, learn more about the things that make our program unique, and note some areas for potential improvement. While the official results of the visit will not be provided until the end of June, the visit team did share the following information:

- The team found us to be compliant or compliant with monitoring in all standards, meeting the goals we set for our self-study. They are recommending no non-compliant or partially compliant ratings.
- The team noted specifically a strong and passionate preceptor pool, noting that the group of preceptors that represented Manchester at the "Preceptor Breakfast" was excellent.
- The team is recommending an accreditation period of eight years, the maximum period allowed.
- The team is recommending that the distance pathway is a go for Fall 2022.
- We'll likely have a focused visit in Fall 2023 to ensure the distance pathway has come to fruition as described, and to serve as an on-site follow up to the virtual visit (required by regulations).

Thank you to all the preceptors who helped us in preparation for this visit and enabled our program to be successful, most notably the members of the Advisory Council and those preceptors that visited with the team on April 14th. We are extremely excited by these results, but not surprised as we know we have a fantastic group of preceptors supporting our students. Thank you all!

#### **Evaluations for Double Rotations**

For APPE Students and Preceptors on Double Rotations (Double Rotations refers to students having two consecutive rotations at the same site with the same preceptor.)

To better maximize the CORE ELMS rotation alert system and facilitate consistency of rotation evaluations, we are implementing the following changes for double rotations beginning with the APPE 2022 – 2023 year as follows:

- 1. Preceptors will complete mid and final evaluations for BOTH rotations.
- 2. Students will complete the mid self-evaluation for BOTH rotations.
- 3. Students will complete an IPE at the end of BOTH rotations.
- 4. Students will complete the evaluation of Site/Preceptor at the end of only the SECOND rotation.
- 5. Affidavits for both rotations may be combined and submitted at the end of the SECOND rotation.
