What is Battle of the Books?

- A+ Partners in Education (HCLS and HCPSS) academic competition for Howard County 5th grade students
- Teams include:
 - Five students from the same school
 - One adult coach
- Teams read 12 pre-determined books
- All participants receive certificates.





- Build teamwork skills
- Learn good sportsmanship skills
- Read different genres (example, science fiction, graphic novels, nonfiction, etc.)
- Increase reading comprehension
- Have fun!



Registration

Coaches need the following information to register:

- 1. For each team member:
 - student name
 - parent phone number
 - parent email address that is checked regularly
- 2. For each coach:
 - coach name
 - phone number
 - email address that is checked regularly
 - mailing address
- 3. Team name
- 4. School name



Registration

- Each team can have up to 5 members to register.
 Alternates not permitted.
- In order to compete, at least 3 team members must participate in the Battle.
- Each team receives one set of books to keep.





Coaches

- Build team spirit and encourage good sportsmanship among your team members
- Set up regular meetings with your team
- Encourage and reward students
- Convey information from HCLS to team members and their parents
- Respond to communications from HCLS in a timely manner







- Moderator asks questions about the books.

- Teams have 30 seconds to discuss their answer.









