NB Updated guidance from the Church of England.

"We strongly advise that face coverings should be worn by all those attending a place of worship, including ministers, worshippers, staff, volunteers, contractors and visitors, where there may be other people present; remembering that they are mainly intended to protect other people, not the wearer, from coronavirus COVID-19 and that they are not a replacement for physical distancing and regular hand washing."

New app to help tackle modern slavery in farming. Raising awareness of the issue of modern slavery is a key concern for our Diocese. Rural slavery in particular often goes unreported and undetected.

With the help of their new <u>Farm Work Welfare App</u>, <u>The Clewer Initiative</u>, is hoping to tackle exploitation in the rural sector by helping people spot the signs of slavery.
