ABOUT THE ACE PROGRAM

An Advocacy Center of Excellence, or ACE, is a Community
Health Center that creates a culture of advocacy to ensure
policymakers at all levels of government commit to investing
in the affordable, equitable, and innovative care that health
centers provide. ACE levels recognize consistent engagement
and demonstrate an ongoing commitment to making advocacy
an organizational priority. ACEs actively partner with the
National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC) on
federal policy issues, as well as their state Primary Care
Association (PCA) on key local-level policy issues impacting
health centers and their patients.

There are three ACE levels – Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Each ACE designation is valid for two years.

ACE Bronze Requirements

To achieve **Bronze Status**, you must complete <u>all</u> of the following requirements:

Bronze Requirements	Completed
Identify an advocacy coordinator at your organization	
Develop an advocacy work plan	
Pass an advocacy board resolution	
Host a National Health Center Week (NHCW) event	
Establish at least one social media account for your organization	
Register at least 20% of staff and board members as advocates at HCAdvocacy.org	
Host a meeting or tour with at least one elected official (or their staff) annually. Meetings can be: • In-person or virtual • Federal, state, or local officials	

To achieve Silver or Gold Status, you must complete <u>all</u>
Bronze requirements as well as a combination of
additional tasks (see next page) to meet the following
point totals:

Silver Status = 40 points Gold Status = 75 points

ACE Silver & Gold Requirements (Silver = 40 pts * Gold = 75 pts)

Register 75% of staff and board members as advocates at HCAdvocacy.org	10	
Submit an op-ed or essay to a publication (local media, blog, partner website, etc.)	10	
Post an advocacy video on social media and tag Member(s) of Congress	10	
Attend an in-district office visit with Member(s) of Congress (or their staff)	10	
Staff or board member attends NACHC's Policy & Issues Forum	10	
Participate in civic engagement efforts (voter registration, Census, etc.)	10	
Host staff or board member advocacy training at your organization	10	
Action alert response rate of 20% over a period of 6 months (HCAdvocacy.org or state alerts)	15	
Register 100% of staff and board members as advocates at HCAdvocacy.org	15	
Staff or board member participation in NACHC's Advocacy Leadership Program (ALP)	15	
Host a round table or candidate forum with elected officials (in-person or virtual)	15
